



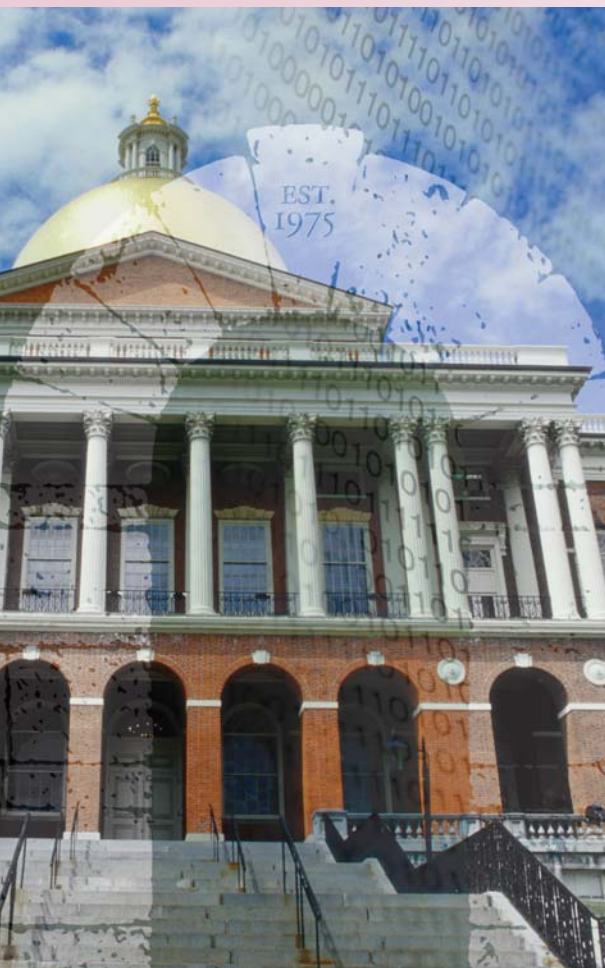
Keystone New Customer Announcement



Center School District Joins The Keystone Family Kansas City, Missouri—April 2006

Located in southern Kansas City this 2,500 student district will be implementing modules from Keystone’s Financial and KEMS (Payroll & HR) product lines throughout the balance of the 2006 calendar year.
